SACRAMENTS

Anointing of the Sick

The special grace of this Sacrament offers the Lord's healing strength, peace and courage to anyone who is seriously or chronically ill, hospitalized or about to undergo surgery. Please contact the Parish Office if you wish to have someone anointed.

Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated twice a month: the first and third Saturday of the month at 11:00 a.m. (some exceptions due to Holy Days and liturgical celebrations). Please call the Parish Office to register for the program and to set a date for the Baptism.

Marriage

Archdiocese of Chicago guidelines for marriage preparation ask that a minimum of six months be set aside for preparation for marriage. No firm date for a wedding will be set until the conclusion of the couple's first meeting with the parish minister. At least one of the engaged persons (or their parents) must be a registered and active parishioner of St. Monica. No Sunday weddings are scheduled.

Ministry to the Sick/Homebound

If you or a family member are in a local hospital or are homebound and would like to have a visit from a priest, please call the Parish Office to make arrangements. Ministers of Care are also available to bring Communion to those who are confined at home and are unable to attend Mass, either temporarily or on a continual basis. Please call the Parish Office to schedule a visit.

Monday — Friday before the morning Mass (please ask for a priest in the sacristy)., Saturday from 3:00 to 3:50 p.m., and 5:30 to 6:00 p.m. (English and Polish). Individual confessions available by appointment.

TREASURES

FROM OUR TRADITION

In recent years, there has been remarkable progress in drawing persons with disabilities into full celebration. Now it is generally accepted that worship places need accommodations such as ramps or elevators, large-print materials for those who are sight-impaired, and perhaps even an assisted hearing system or signing in American Sign Language. American Sign Language is not merely English translated into movement, but a distinct language with its own grammar, syntax (word order), and vocabulary. For this reason, the American Catholic bishops have approved American Sign Language (ASL) as an official language of the liturgy. Celebrating liturgy in our own language (the vernacular) means that liturgy must be accessible to all languages and cultures. The fact that Mass is celebrated this weekend in some places in total silence, but with the full participation of deaf people praising God in the movements of their hands, and sometimes even with a priest who is deaf, is nothing less than the Church being faithful to the image of Jesus, who made the deaf hear and the mute speak. Remember too that deafness is an invisible disability, and that there may well be people in your parish who are quietly yearning for Mass to be signed for them in ASL.

BLESSED

When we think of the word Beatitude we think of today's discourse from Luke's Gospel, or the more familiar one from Matthew (which begins Blessed are the poor in spirit). Actually, beatitudes occur throughout the prophets and Gospels. Today in Jeremiah (with an echo in the psalm) we hear, Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord (Jeremiah 17:7). Following his resurrection in John's Gospel, Christ proclaims, Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed (John 20:29). The evangelists placed these sayings throughout the Gospels as short reminders about the characteristics that one will find in a follower of Christ, characteristics that will help spread the Good News in this life and lead to eternal blessings in the next. In Latin, the saints are called the Beati, the Blessed, for they are the ones who lived the blessed life as described by Jesus throughout the Gospels. How blest are we, when we also strive to make our own days a living beatitude!

SIXTH SUNDAY

IN ORDINARY TIME

Congratulations! Welcome to the Kingdom! Rejoice and leap for joy! Sounds a little like Easter, doesn't it? Well, in a very real way, it is. This Sunday, the scriptures remind us that we are blessed and beloved, especially when we have difficulties and don't feel especially blessed. Jesus reminds us that God blesses us in our trials, so we should trust in the saving power of God. We are raised from the dead, as it were, each time we arise from our hardships. The ultimate proof of all of this is our new life in Christ, who died so that we could be free of sin, and was raised from the dead so that we might all have new life. Wouldn't that be something? A new life, in which poverty is riches and sadness, is transformed into lightness of spirit? It's a topsy-turvy world, isn't it? Do you feel blessed today?

CONGRATULATIONS!

Today's Gospel from Luke is the Sermon on the Plain with the Beatitudes, what we usually think of as the Sermon on the Mount. It seems as though Jesus is congratulating those who would have been considered unfortunate, doesn't it? The Beatitude statements overturn the concept of fortunate in Jesus time, naming those who are poor, hungry, mourning, or marginalized as those who should rejoice. Jesus continues with prophetic and startling Woe to you! statements, directed to those usually thought of as blessed. Heavenly reward is not a privilege of the rich and comfortable but a blessing for all who trust in God, whose reward will be great in heaven.

WHOM DO YOU TRUST?

The first reading and the psalm take a somewhat different focus: trust in God, not people or things of this world. One who trusts in God is fortunate, like a plant that produces good fruit, sustained by living waters and currents of grace. Not so the wicked, who wither and vanish, blowing away, like the illusions of their self-absorption.

Paul, in the second reading, confronts members of the early Christian community of Corinth who were doubting, or devaluing, belief in Jesus' resurrection and the general resurrection of the dead. Depending on the material world in their spiritual pride, they believed that their righteousness was something they had achieved on their own. They felt self-sufficient, rich, not in need of the ongoing saving power of Christ's resurrection that completes the sacrifice of Good Friday through Easter, which is our true blessing.

So, congratulations! Acknowledging our need for God, we are rich in the Kingdom love of our Father. Our hunger is satisfied by the sustaining nourishment of the Spirit. Our weeping is turned into dancing knowing that Jesus is with us in our sorrows, in fact knew them when he walked upon earth. Reasons enough for us to rejoice, always, even when people treat us badly. God's reward to us is the Kingdom, now and always.

SŁOWO

NA NIEDZIELĘ

Najszcześniejszy w życiu Abrahama był dzień, gdy został „załatwiony” przez kuzyna Lota, utracił piękny kawał ziemi wokół Sodomy wyglądający jak raj, a pozostała mu dąbrowa Mamre (hebr. gorycz). Zasmucony brakiem potomka i opuszczony przez kochanego Lota, pełen gorzkich uczuć, Abraham właśnie wtedy spotkał trzech aniołów, którzy zapowiedzieli mu narodziny Izaaka.

Najszcześniejszy w życiu Izaaka był dzień, gdy cierpiął z powodu utraty ukochanej matki przy studni Lachaj Roj. Wtedy zobaczył po raz pierwszy Rebekę, swoją przyszłą żonę!

Najszcześniejszy w życiu Jakuba był dzień, kiedy anioł go okuliwił! Wtedy Bóg mu pobłogosławił.

Granica między szczęściem i nieszczęściem jest bardzo wąska. Największym nieszczęściem jest zastygnąć w powodzeniu jak w skorupie. Kiedy nam się powodzi, stajemy się przelęknionymi więźniami tego powodzenia.

W społeczeństwach o wysokim stopniu rozwoju ekonomicznego jest więcej ludzi chorych psychicznie. Czy bogaci naprawdę są szczęśliwi? Czy doznają pokoju, nie mogąc zasnąć z powodu lęku, by nie utracić tego, co zdobyli? Czy zawsze mają czyste sumienie? Czy nie są zazdrośni i pełni pożądań, uwikłani w niebezpieczne układy i chorobliwe ambicje? Czy ich życie rodzinne jest udane? Czy ich dzieci na pewno dobrze są wychowywane? Czy nie są rozpieszczone i narcystyczne, albo pomijane i zaniedbane?

Szczęście zaczyna się wtedy, gdy umiesz dostrzec w tym, co masz, dobro i rękę Boga! Jego opiekę i miłość. Nie dlatego czujesz się nieszczęśliwy, że czegoś nie masz, ale dlatego, że nie umiesz w tym, co masz, dostrzec dobra, które jest ci potrzebne, by być blisko Boga. Większą biedą jest być pysznym niż ubogim, chciwym niż płaczącym, nieuczciwym niż wyśmianym. Szczęśliwy ten, kto żyje bogactwem Ducha, a nie bogactwem materialnym. Jezus mówi, że nagroda za doczesne utrapienia związane z wiernością Bogu spotka nas dopiero w niebie.

Tak późno? Dlaczego nie teraz? Ponieważ jest tak wielka, że ten świat by jej nie pomieścił. „Zapłata wasza jest w niebie!”. Jest tak ogromna, że tylko niebo ją pomieści. Popatrz na niebo, na gwiazdy, na planety, na księżyc, na tę nieprzeniknioną głębię czerni, i pomyśl, że to, co widzisz, to jeszcze nie jest prawdziwe niebo, tylko jego miniaturka. Nie ma na tym świecie takiego szczęścia i takiego wynagrodzenia, które byłoby właściwe za wierność Jezusowi i jego słowom. Nie każde cierpienie będzie tak obficie wynagrodzone, ale to, które zniósłeś z powodu Jezusa Chrystusa. W Biblii użyto słowa ZAPŁATA. To dwuznaczne słowo. Może oznaczać zarówno nagrodę, jak i karę. Każdy cios i upokorzenie, każde odtrącenie i niesprawiedliwość z tego powodu, że byłeś chrześcijaninem i doznawałeś bólu z powodu swej wierności Jezusowi, będą miały swoją zapłatę. Każdy czyn, każde słowo, każda myśl i każdy gest, każde cierpienie, i powodzenie, każda radość i smutek, mają swoje konsekwencje w wiecznym niebie. Nie ma straty na tym świecie, która nie byłaby wynagrodzona na tamtym. Nie ma też takiej nieuczciwości, która zostałaby pominięta przez odpłatę.

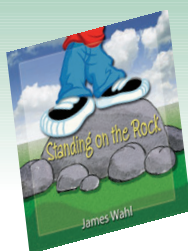

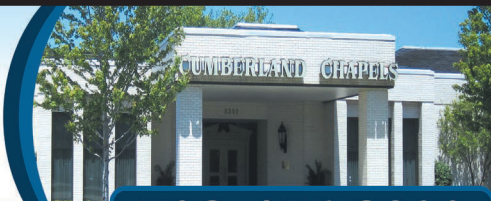
