Anointing of the Sick

The special grace of this Sacrament offers the Lord's healing strength, peace and courage to anyone who is seriously or chronically ill, hospitalized or about to undergo surgery. Please contact the Parish Office if you wish to have someone anointed.

Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated twice a month: the first and third Saturday of the month at 11:00 a.m. (some exceptions due to Holy Days and liturgical celebrations). Please call the Parish Office to register for the program and to set a date for the Baptism.

Marriage

Archdiocese of Chicago guidelines for marriage preparation ask that a minimum of six months be set aside for preparation for marriage. No firm date for a wedding will be set until the conclusion of the couple's first meeting with the parish minister. At least one of the engaged persons (or their parents) must be a registered and active parishioner of St. Monica. No Sunday weddings are scheduled.

Ministry to the Sick/Homebound

If you or a family member are in a local hospital or are homebound and would like to have a visit from a priest. please call the Parish Office to make arrangements. Ministers of Care are also available to bring Communion to those who are confined at home and are unable to attend Mass, either temporarily or on a continual basis. Please call the Parish Office to schedule a visit.




FROM OUR TRADITION

Saturday's feast of the Presentation is a day for the blessing of candles. Why does liturgy require candles? In the first years of the church, worship was often at night, and candles and torches were carried from place to place within the worship space as needed. Candles were also a mark of festivity and hospitality when people gathered for prayer in homes, and later on in large buildings with thick walls and dark corners. But even after gaslight and electricity, candles were kept.

Part of the reason has to do with the warm, clean light of a candle's flame. Candles are a good sign of the partnership of God and creation: wax made by bees, gathered and fashioned by human hands into something beautiful and useful. In order for the light to shine, the candle surrenders itself, almost as if it is pouring itself out so that the light can flood into the world. The candle of baptism, placed into our hands, and carried again and again, speaks silently of that same wisdom. If you would save your life, you must lose it. You must pour your life out like Christ so that you may be filled with the light of his love.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear St. Monica Family,

My friends, as previously promised, I wanted to keep you informed of parish Before I begin I wanted to express my sincerest gratitude to all of you for your continued support to St. Monica Parish. It is hard for me to believe that Christmas & New Year's Celebrations have come and gone. It was a pleasure and honor for myself & Fr. Tom to celebrate the holiday season with you. Furthermore, thank you for your financial support. Moving on to the business part of my "report", I am happy to announce that several projects will be taking place in the upcoming weeks. First of all, the construction will start regarding installation of our new organ. Unfortunately, the completion of this project has taken longer than everyone expected but building a custom made instrument requires a lot of time. Notwithstanding, the company manufacturing our instrument is progress. While we patiently await the organ's arrival we will be using a temporary instrument. The process is lengthy and I believe we are better served exercising patience and being rewarded upon its successful completion.

The other project that will take place in the upcoming weeks is the sanctuary floor. The idea of replacing our old carpet in the sanctuary to hardwood flooring was in my mind since last summer. I did my personal survey regarding the idea and everyone whom I asked was very excited: then the Finance & Parish Councils agreed to the idea as well. My friends this week you will see in the Church a stack of wood that will be used for the floor. The wood needs to acclimate to the temperature inside of the Daily Masses will be celebrated, building. however the altar and the ambo will be placed on the main floor of the church in the main aisle between the pews while the installation is being completed.

Regarding the financial aspects of both of these projects the organ project is a part of TTWCI, the floor was not included in our budget. Thank you to the parishioners who supported and fulfilled their pledges to the TTWCI campaign, as well as the many parishioners and parish groups who donated to the new flooring for the Sanctuary. I would like to thank the Christmas party committee for donating the entire profits of the 2018 parish party and the Simbang Gabi committee for making a substantial gift towards our construction. We are still short approximately two thousand dollars of the ten thousand dollars needed to complete the project I kindly ask you to consider making a donation.

Lastly the date of the Parish Gala is fast approaching. The Gala will take place March 2nd, 2019. In the bulletin there is detailed information regarding the Gala. My friends, I would like to personally invite all of you to this wonderful event, which helps support our St. Monica Academy. Helping our school and ceasing a great opportunity to come together building our St Monica and continue community in a fun environment, don't forget to get your tickets. I look forward to seeing many of our school parents and parishioners.

SŁOWO

NA NIEDZIELE

Boski Mistrz naucza w synagodze rodzinnego Nazaretu. Po przeczytaniu fragmentu z księgi proroka Izajasza, Pan Jezus usiadł. W postawie siedzącej nauczyciele żydowscy nauczali swych uczniów. Jezus więc w autorytecie nauczyciela obwieścił, że jest zapowiadanym przez proroka Mesiaszem. Przyszedł obwołać "Rok łaski od Pana". Jezus miał na myśli rok jubileuszowy, który Izraelici obchodzili co 50 lat. Był to czas darowania długów i kar. Najbardziej korzystali z dobrodziejstw tego roku zadłużeni i ubodzy. Chrystus przyszedł do ludzi, którzy są w potrzebie, czyli do ubogich; do tych, którzy potrzebują Jego miłosierdzia.

Syn Boży obdarował ludzi wolnością, która stanowi niezbywalny fundament naszego życia. Św. Jan Paweł II, odwołując się do Dekalogu, 1991 w 7 czerwca Płocku: "Wolność jest trudna, trzeba się jej uczyć, trzeba się uczyć być prawdziwie wolnym, trzeba się uczyć być wolnym tak, ażeby nasza wolność nie stawała się naszą własną niewolą, zniewoleniem wewnętrznym, ani też nie stawała się przyczyna zniewolenia innych". Jako ludzie wolni posiadamy możliwość wyboru dobra bądź zła, a więc jesteśmy też odpowiedzialni za dokonane czyny. Miarą zaś wolności jest dobro drugiego człowieka.

Kościół nieustanie stoi na straży wolności, której miarą jest wierność Bogu. Naucza, że na tyle jesteśmy wolni, na ile nasze życie podporządkowujemy woli Bożej. Właściwie rozumiana wolność jest wiec zaprzeczeniem zarówno anarchii, jak i samowoli. Zapraszając do naszych serc Jezusa Chrystusa, stajemy się ludźmi wolnymi. Zostajemy wezwani wolności, której żadne ziemskie ograniczenie nie może nas pozbawiać. Przykładem człowieka, który w życiu umiłował wolność i pokazał, jak być wolnym pomimo zewnetrznego zniewolenia, jest dla nas Sługa Boży Stefan kard. Wyszyński (1901-1981). Od momentu aresztowania 25 września 1953 roku aż do 28 października 1956 roku, kiedy odzyskał wolność, Prymas Tysigclecia ostro zaprotestował przeciw oczywistemu bezprawiu. Efekt? Przez trzy lata


przebywał w kolejnych, ściśle odizolowanych od świata, ośrodkach odosobnienia Rywałdzie Stoczku Warmińskim, Prudniku i Komańczy, pozbawiony możliwości jakiegokolwiek kontaktu ze światem zewnętrznym, z rodzing, wiernymi i hierarchia Kościoła. Komunistyczne władze kontynuowały bezwzględną walkę z jedyną realna siła, z Kościołem, który pod przewodnic-

twem Prymasa staopór prowwiała adzonej od lat polityce uznali, że usunięcie hierarchy ułatwi im za-



danie. Niezłomny Prymas dowiódł jednak, że stanowczy opór wobec szykan i bezprawia nie tylko ma sens, ale w rezultacie może przynieść zwycięstwo.

Nie możemy oddzielać Boga od swojego życia, bo to On przez swojego Syna wyswobodził nas do wolności. Bóg nie jest przy nas tylko w niedziele na Mszy świętej, jest przy nas w drugim człowieku, obdarza nas prawdziwą wolnością. Aby jednak być wolnym, trzeba dbać o prawdę w swoim życiu. Rok łaski od Pana trwa nadal. Jezus pragnie obdarzać nas łaską wewnętrznej wolności ale tylko tych, którzy Go potrzebują.


